Spring Creek Oaks Pool Rules

- 1. Pool is for use by SCO Residents and their guests only.
- 2. Children under 8 years old must be accompanied by an adult.
- 3. No pets, bicycles, tricycles, roller skateboards, motorcycles or other wheeled vehicles (strollers exempt) are permitted inside the pool fence.
- 4. Admission to the pool will be refused to anyone with skin abrasions, colds, coughs, and inflamed (red) eyes, infections or bandages at the discretion of the head lifeguard.
- 5. No running in pool area.
- 6. No children over 5 years of age are permitted in the baby pool. Lifeguards are not responsible for the baby pool.
- 7. Babies must wear plastic pants over diapers or "swimming" disposable diapers while in the pool.
- 8. No swimming apparel other than conventional swimsuits will be allowed in the pool. No cutoffs or colored tee shirts.
- 9. No glass containers are permitted in the pool or on pool decks. Paper, cans or plastic containers only on the pool deck.
- 10. Alcoholic beverages, in containers as prescribed in # 9 above, are permitted in the pool area. Consumption of alcoholic beverages must be in accordance with Texas law.
- 11. As a general rule, the clubhouse is closed to swimmers.
- 12. There will be a 10-minute rest period each hour on the hour when the pool is open. Adults may swim during break.
- 13. Anyone behaving in a loud, boisterous or obnoxious manner or using loud, abusive or foul language will be asked to leave the premises at the discretion of the lifeguard.
- 14. **LIFEGUARD MUST BE ON DUTY TO SWIM!** Anyone swimming after hours will be suspended for the remainder of the summer and may have trespassing charges filed against him or her. This does not pertain to the people who have rented the pool and clubhouse for the evening.

Lifeguards are employed to insure the safety of swimmers. They have the authority to remove from the pool area anyone disobeying the rules or endangering the safety of himself or another person. The lifeguard has the authority to suspend the offender for the day. Additional violations will be turned over to the SCO Board. Repeat violations could result in revocation of swimming privileges for the remainder of the summer.
